The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in July 2020. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

July 02, 2020 - On July 2, 2020 at approximately 1730hrs, BID officers were given a BOLO for a murder suspect. The homicide occurred over in the south park area in the early morning hours. The BOLO had a clear description of the individual and has been spotted throughout the district in the past. The crime was transient related and BID officers were put on high alert that evening. Flyers were also distributed to local businesses in an effort to apprehend the individual.

July 06, 2020 - While on patrol, at approximately 0020 hours, officer Sweeny and officer Solorio noticed several vehicles with broken windows along the 400th block of Los Angeles and 400th block of Main street. Officers contacted LAPD for the vandalism report. A supplementary BTFV report was also taken. After concluding their reports LAPD asked BID officers if they could stay posted along the area to deter unwanted activity. BID officers remained on scene for a few hours and noticed nothing abnormal thereafter.

July 12, 2020 - Sergeant Ramos was on his routine patrol when he spotted a group of protestors traveling south bound on 5th and spring. At the moment, the group seemed to be traveling peacefully. Not taking any chances, Sergeant Ramos went ahead and called it in on his radio and within a few minutes had supporting backup. BID officers then remained on the scene and kept a safe distance from the protestors. LAPD units were following close behind and were guiding the crowd outside of the district. No injuries, incidents, or loss of property were reported that day.

July 15, 2020 - At approximately 1730 hours, BID officers received a service call regarding bulk items located at the 623 S Main street encampment. Upon arrival, officers located the bulk items sitting in the bike lane. Sergeant Ramos then proceeded in making contact with the encampment. Once the owner of the bulk items was verified, officers then asked if they could move it from the bike lane. The man then stated that he did not want the items anymore. A secondary call was placed to chrysalis in which they responded shortly after. Chrysalis was able to remove the bulk items from blocking the bike lane.

July 22, 2020 - At approximately 2300 hours, officer Solorio and officer Sweeney were on their evening patrol when they happened to come across an individual who was pacing back and forth. Officers then proceeded to make contact with the individual to check on his well-being. The subject then stated that he was having suicidal thoughts. Without hesitation, officers then contacted LAPD and LAFD for assistance. Both units arrived within minutes and conducted a mental evaluation. LAFD and LAPD then deemed the situation as a credible threat and decided to transport the subject to the nearest mental facility. Officer Sweeney and officer Solorio were thanked by both agencies for their swift actions.

July 25, 2020 - At about 1700 hours, BID officers received a service call about another possible protest passing along 5th and Broadway. Officer Castaneda and officer Marquez were the first on scene. The protest appeared to have at least 30 participants. Officers maintained their uniform presence along Broadway and waited for the group to pass along. Luckily, the group passed along very quickly and without major issues. Later that day the afternoon proved to be peaceful as well. LAPD was not needed for this incident.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

July 2020 - Farmers market proved to be a success as very minimal incidents were reported for the month of July. With additional staff, BID officers are now assigned to be posted throughout the duration of farmers market. This along with LAPD support has been a critical factor in preserving the safety of merchants and pedestrians.

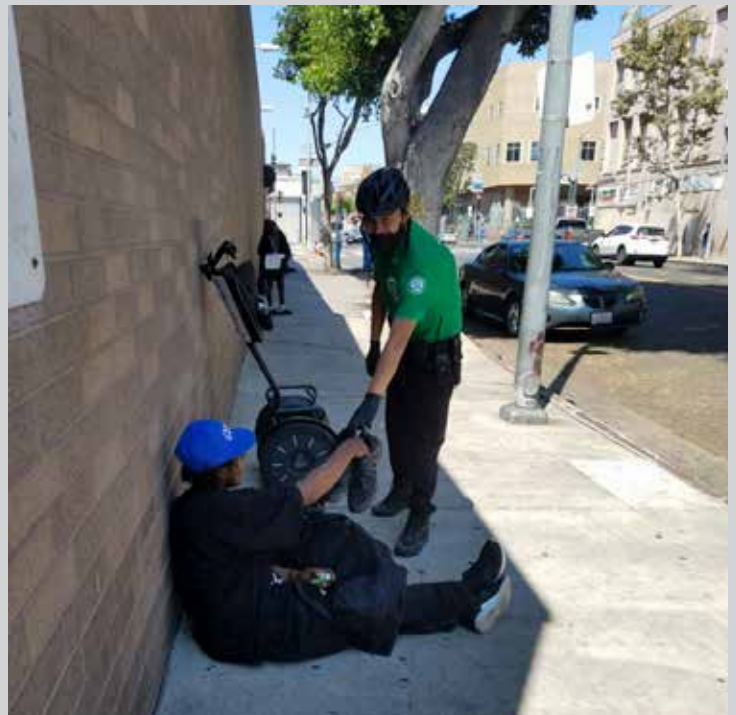

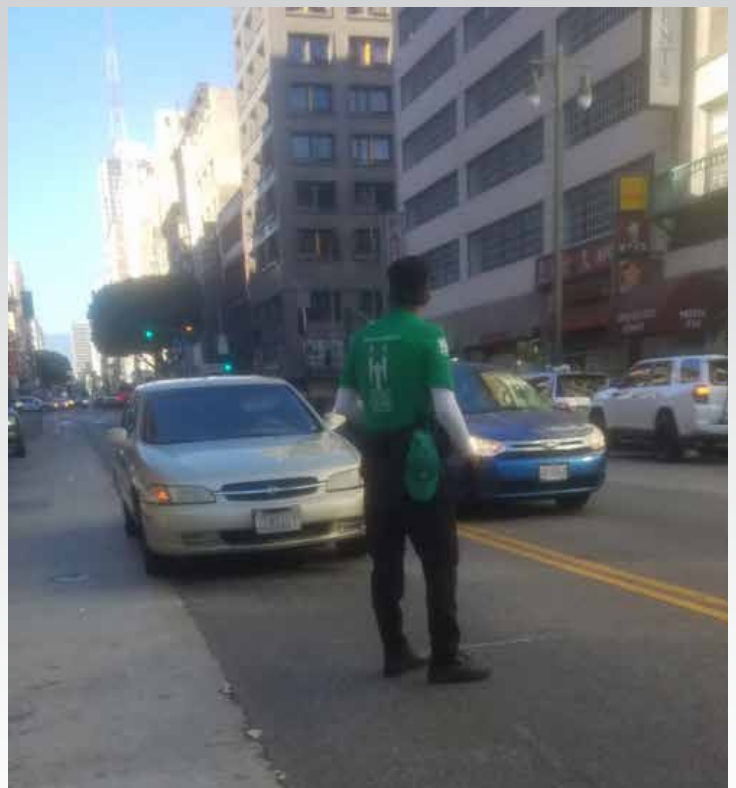
At times, some merchants will donate snacks for the less fortunate.

During this extreme heat, officers make sure to distribute water bottles to those in need.



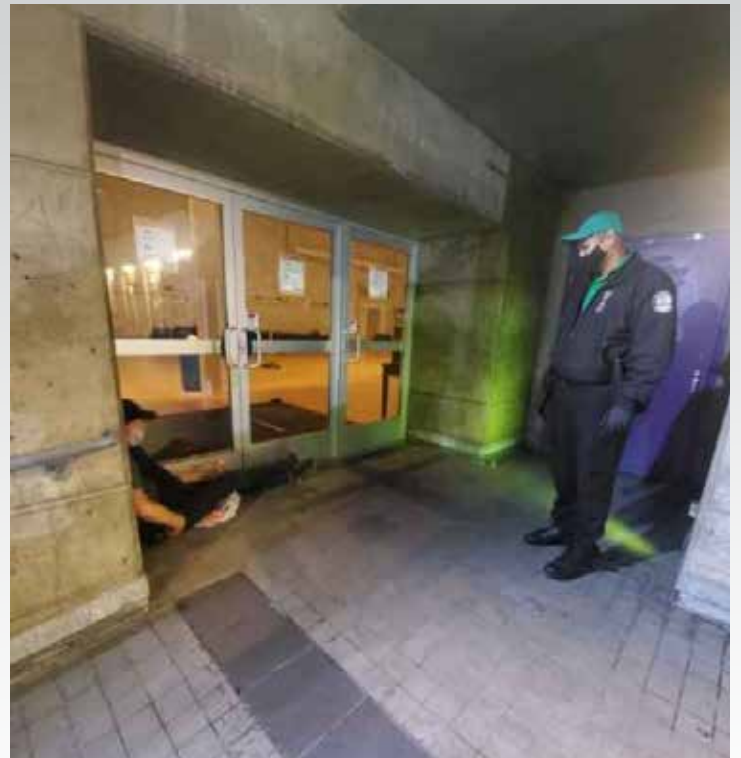
Bike patrol is one of the main methods of patrol for BID officers. Other methods do include vehicle, segways, and foot beats.
